- ✓ The ecology and status of the critically endangered Regent Honeyeater
- ✓ Tips on finding Regent Honeyeaters during bird surveys
- ✓ Temperate woodlands and why the birds that rely on them are so threatened
- ✓ Woodland bird identification basics
- ✓ Separating similar species by sight and sound
- ✓ Recording birds using an online portal or using an app on your phone



At the end of workshop we will travel to a nearby woodland (TBC) looking for Regent Honeyeaters and discussing some of the topics covered in the talk (such as habitat, declines etc). We will also record a bird survey in real-time on a smartphone using the BirdLife Australia Birddata app.
